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In order for goods to qualify for the reduced Customs duties under the North American Free Trade Agreement, a Certificate of Origin is required. Customs allow an abbreviated version to be used for low value commercial shipments. (Less than \$1600.00 Can.) We have noted that many US Vendors either print this short form on their invoice or rubber stamp it on the invoice when required. The format of the certificate is below.
